

## ***NORTHEAST CT FARMERS' MARKET***

**The Northeast Connecticut Farmers' Market began in 1980. It is a vehicle for local farmers to sell their produce and fruit directly to the consumer. This is beneficial to you because you really can't get fruit or vegetables any fresher unless you grow them in your own garden - farmers often pick their crop on market day. You are buying produce that may only be hours off the vine or stalk.**

**You also get items which can't be found at the local supermarket -- specialty beans, heirloom tomatoes, fresh dug garlic and onions, sweet corn just picked; varieties of fruit and vegetables too specialized for a grocery store to bother with.**

**You also get to chat with local farmers and exchange ideas about gardening.**

**And a big highlight of the market, people get to "run into" people they "haven't seen in years" or who they only see at the market. The Farmers' Market becomes a social event.**

**Putnam: Mon and Thurs, 3:30 - 6 PM at the Riverview Marketplace on Kennedy Drive**

**Danielson: Sat. 9-12 noon, Killingly Library.**

**Plainfield: Tues., 4-6 on Rt 12 at the Dollar Store.**

**Brooklyn: Wed., 4-6 pm at the Ocean State Job Lot plaza on Rt. 6.**
